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Tentative Itinerary:

Monday:

Campers will meet their counselor and participate in fun activities at camp today.

Tuesday:

It's time to create! After arriving at camp, campers and their counselors will ride the bus to the Hands-On Art Studio in Fish Creek. They will spend their day with professional artists as they work on individual projects that may include ceramic painting, mosaics, glass fusing, and/or wearable art. Campers' projects will remain at the studio until their next visit on Wednesday.

Wednesday:

Another day at the art studio! Today, campers will work as a team to create an artistic display that will be a permanent fixture at Camp Wabansi. Campers will be guided by the artists as they design and build this project.

Thursday:

It's time to sample more camp activities. Tonight is also Family Night and the optional overnight adventure.

Friday:

Campers will join the rest of camp for traditional activities.

A note to parents:

Please remember that spending two full days at the art studio means that campers will be able to complete some, but probably not all, regular camp activities on the days they remain at camp. Campers will always be back from the art studio in time to ride the bus back to Green Bay at their regularly scheduled bus stops.

Please also take a moment to discuss good behavior with your camper before their session. Campers will be expected to follow directions and treat the art staff and art materials respectfully. Campers should be ready to listen carefully, share space and materials, and act in manner that reflects the values of the YMCA. Counselors will discuss expectations with their campers, as well. By keeping these things in mind, all of our campers will be able to create art beyond their wildest imaginations!

Also be sure that you send in your camper's health form at least two weeks before the first day of the session.
